The Town of Sherman has contracted with Dunn County for collection of Real Estate and Personal Property Tax collection for taxes collected in 2026.

The Following is Due to the Town of Sherman:

2026 Solid Waste/Recycling curb-side pick up at a rate of \$210.00 per household. (Wis. Statutes Sec. 287 require local municipalities to provide recycling services to every household.) See additional information regarding curb-side solid waste and recycling program from Green For Life enclosed.

Dog License fee: \$9.00 for non-neutered or non-spayed, and \$4.00 for neutered or spayed dogs. (Wis Statutes Sec. 174.05 require dog license tax.) Please enclose a copy of certificate of proof of updated rabies shot from vet clinic.

Please make payments payable to the Town of Sherman, and mail to: Town of Sherman, N12457 County Road F, Boyceville, WI 54725 by March 31, 2026.


Welcome to Green for Life! We thank you and appreciate the opportunity to serve your location and look forward to a long relationship.

REGULAR TRASH (All black container)

- **Collection Day:** Collection day is every other week on Mondays with the first collection day on January 5th, 2026.
- Collection times may vary so we ask that you place your cart curbside the night before.
- Cart must be placed correctly to ensure collection. *Carts should be placed on the edge of the property of your residence not on the street.* See diagram below for proper placement.
- All materials must be placed within the cart. Overflow material will require a 24-hour notice. If additional carts are needed, they will be provided at the expense of the resident at \$7.00/month per household per additional cart

RECYCLE COLLECTION (Green lid container)

- **Collection Day:** Collection day is every other week on Mondays with the first collection day on January 5th, 2026.
- Collection times may vary so we ask that you place your cart curbside the night before.
- Collection is of household items only (see attached flyer) All materials can be placed together within the bin and must be clean. If additional carts are needed, they will be provided at the expense of the resident at \$5.00/month per household per additional cart.
- NO PLASTIC BAGS OR FILMS CAN BE PLACED WITHIN THE CART



EXTRA SERVICES

- Up the drive service- Driveways must be approved by the Operations Manager and home owner must sign a waiver that GFL will not be liable for any damage to property and the resident would be responsible for any charges related to damaged and or wrecker/tow bills. Fees would be \$15.00/month billed directly to the resident.

DUMPSTER SERVICES

- Any resident may request that the contractor provide a refuse dumpster in lieu of the 95-gallon cart, subject to approval by contractor. Any additional cost will be the sole responsibility of the household. Any household that request dumpster service would be given a rate less \$12.00 service fee so they are not paying for cart and dumpster services.

BULK ITEM/SPECIAL PICKUP

- Any resident may request a special pickup for a fee per item charged directly to the household. Fees must be paid up front prior to collection. 24 hour notice is required for any special pickups and items must be placed at the curb. Limits do apply. Call for pricing 715-235-9511

 - Appliances
 - Electronics
 - Tires
 - Batteries
 - Bulbs

ADDITIONAL DISPOSAL OPTIONS

- Any Town of Sherman resident may bring the following items to the Boyceville collection site (open limited hours) without a permit located at 1402 Dump Road, Boyceville, WI 54725.
 - Metal (no cost)
 - Waste oil (no cost)
 - Electronics (fee based on type of device)
 - Non-refrigerated appliances (fee depends on type of appliance)

RECYCLE REGULATIONS

- All materials must be rinsed and cleaned out.
- No plastic bags or films can be placed in the container due to causing issues at the sorting centers.
- Only plastics #1, #2 and #5 would be accepted all other plastics would be placed in the trash cart.
- No shredded paper would be accepted. Mixed paper can be placed in a paper bag to help contain the materials within the cart.
- No Carrier Stock would be accepted. Any container that goes in the fridge or freezer would be trash. (frozen dinners, soda, or beer cases)
- Only corrugated cardboard would be accepted. Breaking down cardboard will help save room in the cart.

2026 HOLIDAY SCHEDULE FOR GFL

GFL is closed for all major holidays so that our drivers can spend time with family and friends. If your pickup day falls on or after a major holiday; collection day will be delayed by one day. Be sure that you are setting both trash and recycle carts out the night before to ensure collection.

Memorial Day 2026: Route will run Tuesday, May 26th instead of Monday, May 25th 2026

Labor Day 2026: Route will run Tuesday, September 8th instead of Monday, September 7th, 2026.

Additional Message from the Town of Sherman Board

The town board plans to work on three projects in 2026.

- Finalize the Town Comprehensive Plan. You may remember completing a town survey in 2023. The results of the survey were used to create the Town of Sherman's Comprehensive Plan. The plan serves as a long-range guide to the physical, social, and economic development of the town. It includes a series of data, maps, goals, objectives, policies, programs, and specific actions to guide the town over a 20-year planning period. The last step in the process is to provide you with the final draft of the plan and schedule public hearing meetings(s) to give you an opportunity to ask questions.
- Levy Limit. Each year the state sets our levy limit. We use this levy to create the town budget for the next calendar year. To better care for and maintain our roads, we need to consider exceeding our levy limit. We will be analyzing costs and putting together a plan to extend the levy limit for 2027 for your review and approval prior to 2027 budget planning which takes place in October/November 2026.
- Fire/EMS Coverage. Depending on where you live in the town, your fire/emergency services needs are provided by either Boyceville Fire/EMS or North Menomonie Fire/EMS. All town residents share the cost for both services. North Menomonie Fire/EMS will be increasing the service fees paid by the towns under their service from 7-8% to 30% via incremental increases over the next five years. The board will be researching options to determine if we can get the same service for a lower cost elsewhere. If we are successful, we will bring our findings and proposals to you for consideration.

We encourage you to check the town website regularly for monthly board meetings and agendas, and to attend meetings that have topics of interest to you.
